

Counseling Services

Free, short-term counseling is available to help students cope with, or resolve problems that create distress in daily living and are interfering with academic success at SCC.

What to expect:

Be prepared to describe your problem and your feelings about it, and to develop a plan of action.

Understand that anything discussed will be considered private and confidential unless:

1. You disclose that you are a threat to yourself
2. You disclose that you are a threat to others
3. You disclose abuse, neglect, or exploitation of a child, elderly, or a disabled person
4. You sign a release of your own accord
5. SCC or your counselor is otherwise required by law to disclose information

Understand that by the third session, plans will be made to refer to other resources, including community mental health agencies.

Understand that counseling services at SCC are limited to four sessions.
